On March 1st in Business History

1642 - Georgeana (York), Maine becomes the first incorporated American city. The three-mile-square tract near the mouth of York River was incorporated in 1641 by Sir Ferdinando Gorges, proprietor of the province of Maine, as the town of Agamenticus. In 1642, Gorges, who wanted a suitable capital for the province, turned the town corporation into a chartered city and renamed it Georgeana. 1873 - E. Remington and Sons begin manufacturing the first practical typewriter (invented by Christopher Sholes, Carlos Glidden and Samuel W. Soule) in Ilion, New York.

1913 - Federal income tax takes effect in accordance with the U.S. Congress's 16th Amendment.

1933 - Bank holidays are declared in six states, to prevent a run on U.S. banks.

1937 - Congress of Industrial Organizations (CIO) chief John L. Lewis and U.S. Steel president Myron Taylor sign a landmark contract in which U.S. Steel officially recognized the CIO as sole negotiator for the company's unionized workers.

1962 - The first Kmart store opens in Garden City, Michigan

1977 - Bank of America adopts the name VISA for their credit card.


