Business History Conference Announces Recipients of Awards and Grants for 2007

At the Business History Conference annual meeting held on May 31 to June 2 in Cleveland, it was announced that Louis Galambos of Johns Hopkins University received the Business History Conference Lifetime Achievement Award. The award is bestowed every two or three years to a nominee who has contributed the most to the work of the Business History Conference and to scholarship in business history. On July 1st in Business History

1858 - The first Canadian coins are minted $(1\phi, 5\phi, 10\phi \text{ and } 20\phi)$.

1862 - U.S. Congress approves the Revenue Act, notable for creating the Bureau of Internal Revenue to collect the revenue generated by its new taxes.

1916 - Coca-Cola adopts its distinctive contoured bottle.
1941 - During a baseball game broadcast, NBC runs the first TV commercial sanctioned by the Federal Communications Commission. Bulova paid \$9 to advertise its watches.
1967 - The European Community is formally created out of a merger with the Common Market, the European Coal and Steel Community, and the European Atomic Energy Commission.
1987 - Top investment banker Geoffrey Collier receives the first conviction for insider dealing since it became illegal.
1990 - East Germany accepts the Deutsche Mark as its currency, thus uniting the East and West German economies.
