In Remembrance of Dr. Milton Friedman

Noted economist, Nobel laureate, and Hoover senior research fellow July 31, 1912 - November 16, 2006

Milton Friedman, recipient of the 1976 Nobel Memorial Prize for Economic Science and a senior research fellow at the Hoover Institution since 1977, died on November 16, 2006. He was 94. Friedman had the distinction of being the recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom and the National Medal of Science, both awarded to him in 1988.

A longtime and outspoken proponent of political and economic freedom, Friedman conceived many of the most important innovations in economic theory during the second half of the 20th century. Of those, his landmark work explaining monetary supply and its effect on economic and inflationary shifts garnered him worldwide renown and respect.

Friedman, who often served as an adviser and sage for many government leaders, played a key role in the United States' economic policy despite never having formally served in an administration after World War II. He also was known for championing school vouchers, particularly through the foundation he and his wife created, the Milton and Rose D. Friedman Foundation for Educational Choice. On December 1st in Business History

1909 - The Pennsylvania Trust Company, a Carlisle, PA-based bank, becomes the first financial institution in the United States to set up Christmas Club accounts.
1914 - The San Francisco Stock & Bond Exchange is the first U.S. exchange to re-open its doors for business since the U.S. markets temporarily shut down to safeguard against a debilitating bear run following the outbreak of World War I.

1995 - Michael Monus, former president of the Phar-Mor drug store chain, is found guilty of embezzling roughly \$1 billion from the company. Following a long trial, Monus received a 20-year prison sentence and a \$1 million fine. Prosecutors accused Monus of funneling money from Phar-Mor to finance his high-flying habits and to prop up a profit-poor minor league basketball venture, forcing massive layoffs and extensive store closings at Phar-Mor. At one point, the situation became so dire that Phar-Mor had to head to federal court to stave off bankruptcy.




